mmigrant workers are especially vulnerable to workplace abuses. They suffer higher rates of on-the-job injuries, illnesses and fatalities than other workers.

But employers routinely threaten, harass, intimidate—even fire—workers who try to form unions. In addition, more than half of employers threaten to call the Citizenship and Immigration bureau when immigrant workers form their own union.

When employers block workers' freedom to form unions, wages and benefits shrink. Inequality and poverty grow, race and gender gaps widen, public services are shortchanged and the door opens wide to more employer abuse of workers. *All* workers.
